Charlotte is comprised of a variety of neighborhoods and lifestyles with enough diversity so that everyone can find what they are looking for in a home! From nightlife and corporate businesses in Uptown, arts in Southend, shopping in Southpark and tree-lined streets in Myers Park and Eastover!



Uptown Charlotte, within the bounds of I-277, is divided into four wards by the intersection of Trade and Tryon Streets. Museums, sporting venues, shops, hotels, restaurants, and bars are heavily concentrated in Uptown Charlotte.



Southend is a neighborhood immediately south of Uptown-The area is notable for the number of renovated factories and eclectic mix of retail, commercial and high end residential construction. Home of the Lynx...today, Historic South End has earned a reputation as an area that once again is a corridor for creativity, innovation and unmatched design talent in the Charlotte-Metro Region. South End is a true mixed-use urban neighborhood, with a variety of retail, businesses, and housing.



Plaza Midwood is one of Charlotte's most diverse and eclectic neighborhoods. Located just northeast of Uptown, the area is home to a thriving business district, a picturesque historic neighborhood, and one of Charlotte's most prestigious country clubs. The focus of the neighborhood is The Plaza, a tree-lined boulevard that bisects it north to south, from Central Avenue to its intersection with Parkwood Avenue. The neighborhood gets its name from The Plaza and Midwood, one of its larger subdivisions.



Dilworth-Like neighboring Myers Park, the streets of Dilworth feature stately, mature oak trees, sidewalks, and houses with front porches. Unlike neighboring Myers Park, most of the homes are more conservative bungalows. Dilworth is also home to the Charlotte area's largest hospital, Carolinas Medical Center. New townhomes and condos in the area just off of East Blvd., offering easy access to shops and dining and also easy access to the new Lynx light rail service.



Myers Park is one of the premier neighborhoods of Charlotte. The Myers Park neighborhood is that area bounded by Queens Road on the north; Providence Road on the east; Sharon Road on the south; and Colony Road, East Woodlawn Road, and South Kings Drive on the west. Myers Park is home to Queens University and the Duke Mansion, Freedom Park and many more wonderful attractions. Its beautiful tree lined streets make it such an enjoyable place to walk and bike. It's wonderful restaurants, shopping, schools and close proximity to Dilworth, Eastover and Southpark make it a great neighborhood to call home!



Eastover bordering Myers Park is another prestigious neighborhood of Charlotte with gorgeous homes and streets. Eastover is home to many local shops and restaurants. One of it's largest features is The Mint Museum of Art on Randolph Road.



Southpark, a few minutes south of Myers Park, is just a short commute to Uptown. Southpark has become a defining element of South Charlotte. It has fantastic shopping and restaurants! Home to the largest shopping mall in Charlotte, Phillips Place Shops and many new real estate developments! It's a hip place to live with many amenities!



The **Cotswold** neighborhood most likely takes its name from a large shopping center, Cotswold Village Shops, located at the intersection of Randolph and Sharon Amity Roads. Originally known as Cotswold Mall, it was Charlotte's first suburban mall. Cotswold is emerging as one of the more desirable areas for living and shopping with close proximity to Uptown. The neighborhood contains new and old homes with many of the 50's and 60's homes being remodeled. This wonderful community is neighbored by Myers Park and Eastover and has many dining and shopping options.
